COVER STORY 1 - PAYAL NANJIANI

The year is 1992. I clearly remember giving my 10th grade board exam with just one resolute thought in mind. I need to get a 75% so I can apply to Jai Hind College and get into the first list. There was no other college I wanted.

And that's exactly what happened. I scored an exact 75% and got into Jai Hind College to complete my B.Com degree. And from there started my journey with the firm belief- I will and I can.

But did I plan my journey to becoming an executive coach, and an international author. Absolutely not. Let me be truthful here.

Though my books are awarded the Books of Excellence, and The Times Group recognized me as the most influential leadership speaker and executive coach, life wasn't always like this for a girl born in India with an adult life in America. Let me tell you something about my life and the transformation I had to bring myself to get where I am.


'How on the earth did I get here?' is a question people have asked me numerous times. But for the first time, I asked this question myself as I walked up the stage, clad in my blue shirt and black suit, to receive the prestigious Times Group Award for the most influential Executive coach.

While walking up to the stage, I heard the presenter read my bio, saying that I was the only woman of color from India to be recognized as a leadership author and coach in a completely white male-dominated industry in America

It was then when, for the very first time, I thought to myself that there were no authors or coaches in my family background. Then how did a woman of color like me, from a working-class family, compete and make a name in a predominantly white male-dominated society?

If you had met with me in 1996, when I completed my undergrad in economics from Jai Hind college, my life would have looked entirely different.

I was raised in a generation where girls were taught the art of taking care. My mom constantly reminded me to



After completing my undergrad in 1996, I had no clear goal or dream for my future. My mom thought it would be better if I got married as she kept speaking to me about it, and I would hear her out.

My father had a different opinion from everyone else around me. He encouraged me to study further and complete my master's. I agreed, not because I liked the MBA, but because I got seduced by the societal norms of having an MBA degree under your belt. And also because it would keep marriage off the chart for me for some time at least.

After completing my MBA, I started working. It is here that I dreamt of doing something big in my life. I imagined a life entirely of success. When I would tell my mom of my dreams, she would smile and calmly remind me that doing big things is not for everybody. She would often say that not everyone can be an Ambani or a Sam Walton, for that matter, and that they were born with something different in them, and everyone is not cut to make it to the top.



Her words made me feel I did not have that "something" in me to reach the top. And she was right. Even the business world would often portray successful people in ways that made all of us believe that they just had something in them that you and I did not.

My life dragged between office and home for the next seven years. I often would blame my luck, destiny, people, environment, boss, country, and everything around me for failure. I would also blame God for not giving me that "something" special in me to be successful. Come 2001, I was an ordinary girl doing a nine-to-five job, working hard, and living the 'American dream' to some extent. In the evening, I would meet up with friends or colleagues over a drink or dinner, and on weekends, I would relax, get a few DVDs from Blockbuster (yeah, they existed at one time), or snuggle tight in bed for long hours.

I had yet to decide what to do with my personal and career life. I had a job, but I needed direction and a purpose. My self-worth was non-existent. I just felt like I was nowhere. I wasn't growing at work and had many failures at my jobs. Growth, leadership roles, achieving something big in my career life, and making it to the top were not on my watch in those days.

Every time I hit rock bottom in my career, I would work on skilling and upskilling myself, listening to motivational tapes, and reading as much as possible to help improve my results in life. But I was in the same old cycle of procrastinating, binge-watching, and getting stuck in my career. Yes, that was my life. Unbelievable as it may sound, it's the holy truth. So, what changed, and how did I become one of the most well-known executive coaches? How did I become the first choice for Fortune 100 companies as a coach for their CEOs and senior leadership teams? How did I reach the top in my field and be among the highest-paid executive coaches?

I have a lot to thank the Universe and my father for this.

During those confusing and humdrum years of my career, my father put the seed of a dream into me, saying I could be anything I wanted to be and that life had many possibilities. It was the first time someone had said something like this to me. Now, like me, if you've been in America for most of your life, then you know the market is flooded with self-development gurus and tapes that tell you to believe in yourself and that you can do just about anything.

But when the real people in your closest circle tell you the same things, it enters right into your soul. I was hungry to make something out of myself (and frankly more terrified that I'd amount to nothing). I wanted to leave my mark on the world. I wanted to create history, not become history.

And so, I began looking up books and the internet to know what it takes to reach the top.

And I found that the business world, teaches us that not everyone can reach the top.

On the other hand, in the same business world, we are trained to maximize our potential, saying that we all can succeed and reach the top. Now, aren't these confusing messages?

Add to this the fact that our world is whole of information on what it takes to succeed and reach the top. The question that perturbed me was this: if everyone knows what it takes to be successful and all of us in the corporate world are 'well-trained,' then why are so many people in the workforce struggling to achieve their definition of success?





Why do so many people retire with a feeling of unfulfillment? Why do so many do people's dreams die? Why can only a few of us make it to the top? Why? By the time this book lands in your hands, I will have coached more than a thousand leaders and impacted the lives of more than a million professionals, helping them reach the top. As an executive coach, I know why many people don't get to the top.

Let me be honest here. The reason why many do not make it to the top is not because of a lack of information or skills. I have private access to some of the world's most successful industry leaders and can tell you that those who truly make it to the top in their careers are the ones who have worked harder on themselves than on their job.

Those who work hard on themselves instead of their job are invested in their personal development. They give time to themselves. Giving time to yourself for your internal development is the most expensive gift you can give yourself.

They are committed to bringing about a transformation in the way they think and behave. Personally, I regret not knowing about this early on in my career. My father once gave me advice, which helped me tremendously. He said, 'Payal, nobody can give you wiser advice than yourself. So, at all times, keep uplifting yourself so that you give great advice yourself." He couldn't have been more right. Out of everyone you know, you are the only person always present in your life, non-negotiable, day and night. And so it's essential that you consistently work on the most critical person in the world: yourself. When we have a harmonic relationship with ourselves, we no longer look to other people to fill the gaps in our self-esteem. We need people, but we aren't emotionally greedy or dependent. As Wayne Dyer said, "You can never feel lonely when you like the person you're alone with."

In our day-to-day corporate life, we need more time to work on developing ourselves. I encourage you to work on and invest in developing yourself.

My life is not perfect. Things have happened and will continue to happen. However, I am not so much concerned about what will happen because I have learned to unleash my leadership powers and have faith in a higher power.

To anyone who needs to hear this today, There is no one, absolutely no one, whom the Universe has created to be unsuccessful. Each of us is here to succeed. We are here in the corporate world to make it to the top.

As a child, I never actually believed much in myself. Like anyone else, I would often go with what others thought about me. And as I stepped into the workforce, my focus was more on how to fit into a white male-dominated work culture in Corporate America. I never thought I would grow up to impact millions of lives globally. And that I would write award-winning books, coach high-end executives, and speak on stages globally. But it happened to me. And it happened because I learned that one must never try to fit in when the Universe has created you to be unique and stand out in ways only you can. I hope this can be a testament and a reminder to YOU that you can achieve your dreams and do what you are created for. Let's give more power to ourselves than to our environment. The most challenging part of human life is accepting and utilizing your powers to achieve infinite possibilities Many of us are afraid to step into our success because we are too busy comparing ourselves to someone else. You are unique and can make a difference.

All of us want promotions and salary increases. We desire to make it to the top. But most of us don't realize that these things cannot be asked for by putting our hands out. You get that promotion, the salary raise, the new project, the visibility, the sponsors, the accolades, the achievements when you work on yourselves. It's time you become such that success, promotion, and job offers begin to follow you everywhere.

We all face challenges and deal with setbacks. But in the long run, you'll achieve incredible growth and success if you're willing to change your thinking and behaviors.

Remember, success, growth, promotion, and visibility don't happen purely because of hard work and effort; they occur as a result of the way you transform yourself in your habits.

I believe you have what it takes to make it in today's competitive and changing business environment.

I promise you that you can achieve everything you've wanted in your career if you are prepared to transform yourself. Are you ready to unlock your leadership powers and live your best life?

COVER STORY 2 - MISHTI KHATRI

When I stepped into Jai Hind College in 2013, I was continuing a family legacy. My grandfather, father, and aunt had all walked these same corridors, each with their own stories of learning and growth. My father often reminisces about his time at Jai Hind—how different yet similar student life was back then.

For me, choosing Jai Hind was about stepping out of my comfort zone. Having grown up and studied all my life in Juhu, I wanted to experience South Mumbai's vibrant college life, learn how to navigate the local trains, and immerse myself in a new environment that would shape my personality and career.





While I had come from an ISC science background, but I was eager to explore the world of commerce and management; leading me to pursue a Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS). At the time, my dream was to enter the field of sports management. Having been actively involved in sports from a young age, I was always drawn to the idea of working in the sports industry. My love for sports had been ingrained in me since childhood, from playing football and tennis to swimming competitively. That passion made sports management feel like a natural career path. Coming from a rigorous science curriculum, BMS was an entirely different world, filled with case studies, marketing strategies, and financial models. While it was initially overwhelming, it gave me a well-rounded understanding of business, which later proved invaluable in my career.

Jai Hind wasn't just about academics; it was where I discovered my true

passion. We were encouraged to take internships and work in our summer breaks so I made the most of them. I initially interned with Procam International—one of India's premier sports event management companies—where I got a first-hand look at how large-scale marathons and sporting events were organized. That experience was eye-opening, but it was my second internship with HEAL, a physiotherapy and strength and conditioning clinic, during my second-year summer that changed everything. Working with HEAL, I was exposed to the world of fitness, working with professional and young athletes. I realized that my passion lay in working directly with athletes and







individuals, helping them improve their performance and wellbeing.

Outside of academics and internships, I was deeply involved in sports and extracurricular activities. I played football, participated in running events, and was an active part of Jai Hind's festivals. One of my fondest memories was being part of Talaash, where I worked behind the scenes organizing events, which helped me hone my communication and teamwork skills. These experiences, though unrelated to my eventual career, played a crucial role in shaping my confidence and ability to work in high-pressure environments.

Jai Hind had a unique way of preparing us for the real world. The college emphasized practical learning through challenging assignments and projects rather than just exams. This approach fostered an entrepreneurial mindset in me—something I carried forward when I started working as a personal trainer.

After graduating, I completed my American College of Sport Medicine certified personal training course and subsequently worked as a personal trainer with HEAL and Kinetic Living (a Mumbai based gym) for five years, coaching individuals, athletes and groups from diverse backgrounds. During this time, I also worked with Nike as a pacer, leading running groups and helping athletes push their limits. Running became a significant part of my life, and I competed in several half marathons and 10K races. The experience of pacing for Nike was transformative—it taught me how to motivate people, understand their struggles, and push them toward their goals.

In 2019, I took a leap of faith and moved to the UK to pursue an MSc in Sport Nutrition at the University of Huddersfield. Leaving behind the familiarity of home and stepping into a new country was daunting, but it was also the best decision I ever made. Adjusting to a different culture, academic system, and even the unpredictable weather in the UK presented challenges. There were moments of loneliness and self-doubt, but over time, I built a strong support system, adapted to the rigorous coursework, and embraced new experiences. Despite the initial struggles, this journey of independence and resilience became one of the most rewarding experiences of my life, shaping me into the person I am today. I hadn't read a research paper or done any kind of academic writing before going to the UK but I thoroughly enjoyed working through these challenges and developing new skills. I was able to publish my master's thesis, a systematic review on collagen supplementations as well (Khatri M, Naughton RJ, Clifford T, Harper LD, Corr L. The effects of collagen peptide supplementation on body composition, collagen synthesis, and recovery from joint injury and exercise: a systematic review. Amino Acids. 2021 Oct;53(10):1493-1506. Doi: 10.1007/s00726-021-03072-x. Epub 2021 Sep 7. PMID: 34491424; PMCID: PMC8521576).

The program gave me a strong foundation in sports nutrition, and during my time there, I was awarded a chance to a full scholarship to pursue a PhD after securing a distinction in my master's program. Applying for the scholarship was a rigorous process—I had to develop a compelling research question, justify its significance, and demonstrate my ability to conduct independent studies. Crafting my proposal and refining my research focus was both challenging and exhilarating, as it allowed me to dive deep into a topic I was truly passionate about. My research focused on the effects of nitrate supplementation on female endurance performance and oxygen consumption during sub-maximal cycling. It is a niche area, and I was passionate







about it because research in sports science often focuses on male athletes, with little attention given to female physiology. Over the next three years, I conducted studies, worked with female athletes, and even took on teaching roles. Living and studying in the UK broadened my perspective and reinforced my larger goal—to return to India and work with female elite athletes, helping them gain global recognition.

Today, I find myself at an exciting intersection of research, coaching, and practical application. I work as a sport nutritionist for young athletes and celebrities, ensuring they fuel their bodies correctly for optimal performance or prep for an exciting film role. Alongside this, I continue working with Nike as a running coach, helping women train smarter, build confidence, and achieve their personal bests. I have been a part of Nike global campaigns like 'Make the World Listen' and now the After Dark Tour global race series. And of course, I am in the final stretch of completing my PhD.

Beyond my hands-on work, I also run an Instagram page with around 40,000 followers, where I share insights on nutrition, running, and training (@mishtikhatri). This allows me to educate and engage with a larger audience, breaking down complex concepts into practical, actionable advice.

Looking back, Jai Hind was more than just a college—it was the place where I found my purpose, shaped my skills, and built the foundation for everything I do today. The friendships I made, the lessons I learned, and the experiences I gained all played a role in making me who I am. My days are a blend of science, sweat, and strategy—exactly the mix I'd hoped for when I left college. To current students: embrace the challenges, step out of your bubble, and explore every opportunity. You never know where it might lead!

For those passionate about sports, fitness, or any unconventional career path, my advice is to trust the journey. When I first started out, I wasn't entirely sure where my career would take me. There were moments of doubt—whether it was shifting from sports management to personal training or moving across the world for my education. But each challenge taught me resilience, adaptability, and the importance of staying open to opportunities. The road might not be linear, and you might pivot several times before finding what truly excites you. But every step, every experience, and every challenge will contribute to your growth.

Jai Hind gave me the platform to dream big, and for that, I will always be grateful.

How to handle the fear of public speaking

As a communication trainer, I often find that students in colleges, employees in organizations, as well as CEOs and start up founders, struggle when it comes to making presentations. They have great ideas, but when it comes to public speaking and presenting these ideas to an audience, they are gripped with fear and panic before their presentation. If you are someone who has public speaking fear, then here are 5 tips to help you overcome stage fear.

1. Smile intentionally and appropriately

Be intentional about smiling appropriately and not frowning by default. Always remember that a smile begets a smile, a frown begets a frown. Your audience is not your enemy. So, even before you begin your presentation, look at your audience and smile. They will respond with a smile. This will help calm your nerves and bring you in a positive state of mind. A smile will also positively impact your tone of voice.

2. Think Takeaways

Ask yourself: what are the key takeaways / key learnings / key benefits that the audience will receive by listening to me? Reminding yourself of the clear takeaways of your presentation, will build your self-confidence, as you see how you are adding value to their lives. It will also ensure that you have a razor focus on the value you are communicating to your audience. This will enhance your presentation skills.

3. Meet and Greet

If you find yourself in a new environment—this could be in an unfamiliar conference room, meeting hall, auditorium, perhaps visiting a new institute or organization—there are chances that you could experience a little 'more than usual' presentation anxiety.

So, here is how you can handle the additional stress: before you begin your presentation, meet with the people in the room. Introduce yourself, appreciate them for coming on time and inquire about their role in the organization. As you build these relationships, you will feel comfortable and confident and your 'speaking stress' will reduce.

4. Engage with your audience

There are strategic advantages to creating opportunities for audience engagement. When the audience responds to you as a speaker, it strengthens the speaker-audience connection and increases the probability of making an even greater impact.

You, as a public speaker, can engage with your audien	ce by asking them to participate in a poll. For example, you
can say, "Raise your hand if you agree with	or you can ask them a specific question and
have them contribute towards the solution.	



1Craig Communicates (OPC) Private Limited Or you can tell a story, build a scenario or share statistics; then provide them with key learnings from it and follow that up by asking their opinion on the same. These are approaches to share the spotlight, build audience connection and in the process, build our confidence as well.

5. Rehearse, Relate, Relax

There are some people who believe that if you rehearse your speech or presentation, it will make you sound robotic. This is a wrong assumption. Rehearsing (practicing) your speech or presentation will enable you to be more in control and will boost your confidence. Your flow of thought and flow of words will be clear. Rehearsal will also help you fine tune your message, so that you can relate and connect with your audience better. Rehearsal will put you in a better state of mind and enable you to relax before your presentation.

Conclusion

Do not fear the opportunity to speak in public. Rather, be thankful as this puts you in a position to make a significant impact and rise in your influence in the organization. As you focus on the value that you bring to the room and consistently show up to present, your stage fear will reduce, your confidence will improve and you will grow to be an effective communicator. 

For eg - The Logo of Talaash Festival was developed by our Batch of 2015, we had ideated the logo in such a way that it could remain constant for the years to come, unlike the previous practice of each year having a different logo. It makes us proud to see that the logo has not been changed over 10 years and has become a quick brand recall amongst various colleges across Mumbai & India.

3) Your favourite Professor?

Dr. Rakhi Sharma was my favorite professor because of her incredibly practical and engaging teaching style. She had a unique ability to connect management theories with real-world scenarios, making every lesson not just informative, but truly eye-opening. Her classes were never just about memorizing concepts—they were about understanding how to apply them to solve real-life problems. Through case studies, interactive discussions, and real-time problem-solving exercises, she challenged us to think critically and creatively. Her passion for pushing boundaries on education, teaching and her focus on practical learning has left a lasting impact on me and shaped the way I approach challenges today.


"Though the light of their presence may have dimmed, their warmth will forever echo in our hearts"
